

Remote Learning – information for parents in the event of a whole class isolation

<p>How will your child access remote learning?</p> <p>We will set work that mirrors the school curriculum. Your child should access this through the see-saw app, each morning.</p>	<p>How will your child submit work and receive feedback from their teacher?</p> <p>The class teacher will set out a timetable of registration, Maths, English and Story time sessions on the Teams platform. This will be supplemented with independent work for the children to complete which can be downloaded from the seesaw app. Learning clinics will be available during the afternoon to support children who are experiencing difficulties with their independent work. Your child should submit their work by uploading it onto Seesaw by the end of the day. The teacher can then check the work, provide feedback using the see-saw app, and amend their planning.</p>
<p>Appropriate clothing and environment for remote learning</p> <p>3 School Rules are respect, safety, learning. Clothing appropriate for school please – no pyjamas. In an appropriate room – not a bedroom or bathroom. Away from distractions (pets, TV) etc. Mute the audio when the teacher is talking please. Teaching staff will be following the Staff Code of Conduct and acceptable use of ICT policy as usual.</p>	<p>Registering and attendance</p> <p>Children have been issued with a login for Microsoft Teams. Each day the teacher will arrange a teams call with the class to register attendance. The time for this will be communicated by the teacher to the class through see-saw. Pupils not present without an explanation will receive a phone call from the school office or learning mentor in line with usual attendance procedures. Parents should inform school if pupils are not able to attend remote learning by emailing GCA-enquiries@ipmat.co.uk</p>
